- 3. Repaint pony walls around pool and recoat pool deck (obtaining bids)
- 4. Complete Reserve Study (rescheduled)
- 5. Replace leaking water fountain at park.
- 6. Obtain quotes for asphalt repairs in Block B
- 7. Work with Pima County to repair the black paved walking path parallel to Sycamore Leaf. They are researching who is responsible for maintaining that path.
